

Amble locality lies in the North Service Area of Northumberland and has a population of 6,551. It measures 14 km<sup>2</sup> in terms of area (the smallest locality in the North Northumberland Service Area), and has a population density of 461 people per km<sup>2</sup> (the highest population density of all localities in the North Northumberland Service Area). Amble locality includes the town of Amble and Coquet Island.

## Key Issues for Amble Locality

### People & Place

- 59.6% of the population are of working age (females 16 to 59 years, males 16 to 64 years), North Northumberland 58.8%, and Northumberland 60.2%.

### Community Involvement & Cohesion

- 73.2% of people overall are satisfied with their area as a place to live (North Northumberland 83.1%, Northumberland 80.9%).
- 12.2% of people (during previous 12 months) were involved in decisions that affect their local area (North Northumberland 20.6%, Northumberland 17.1%).

### Economic Well-being

- 21.9% of people usually travel to work by bicycle or on foot (North Northumberland 16.0%, Northumberland 13.0%).
- 17.0% of people are income deprived (North Northumberland 12.4%, Northumberland 14.0%).

### Housing

- 57.4% of all dwellings are fall into council tax 'Band A' (North Northumberland 39.2%, Northumberland 48.1%).
- 39.8% of household spaces are terraced (North Northumberland 27.3%, Northumberland 28.9%).
- 81.7% of people are satisfied with their home as a place to live (North Northumberland 90.3%, Northumberland 90.2%).
- The average house price is £129,738 (North Northumberland £207,956, Northumberland £179,852).

### Transport & Services

- 38.3% of people are satisfied with local bus services (North Northumberland 41.2%, Northumberland 45.4%).

### Community Safety

- There were 229.1 incidents of anti social behaviour per 1000 population between July 2008 and June 2009 (North Northumberland 68.7%, Northumberland 78.6%).
- 13.3% of people agree that parents take enough responsibility for the behaviour of their children (North Northumberland 40.5%, Northumberland 34.2%) and 40.1% of people think that people not treating each other with respect and consideration is a big problem (North Northumberland 20.8%, Northumberland 26.8%).
- The following percentages of people see the following forms of anti social behaviour as a big problem, teenagers hanging around on the streets (70.9%), rubbish and litter lying around (67.8%), people using or dealing drugs (58.0%), people being drunk or rowdy in public places (56.3%), vandalism graffiti and other deliberate damage to property/vehicles (54.0%).
- 51.0% of people feel safe when outside in their local area after dark (North Northumberland 72.7%, Northumberland 64.1%).

### Health & Social Well-being

- 65.7% of people are satisfied with their local hospital (North Northumberland 73.5%, Northumberland 75.6%).
- 68.6% of people think their general health is either good or very good (North Northumberland 74.1%, Northumberland 73.0%).
