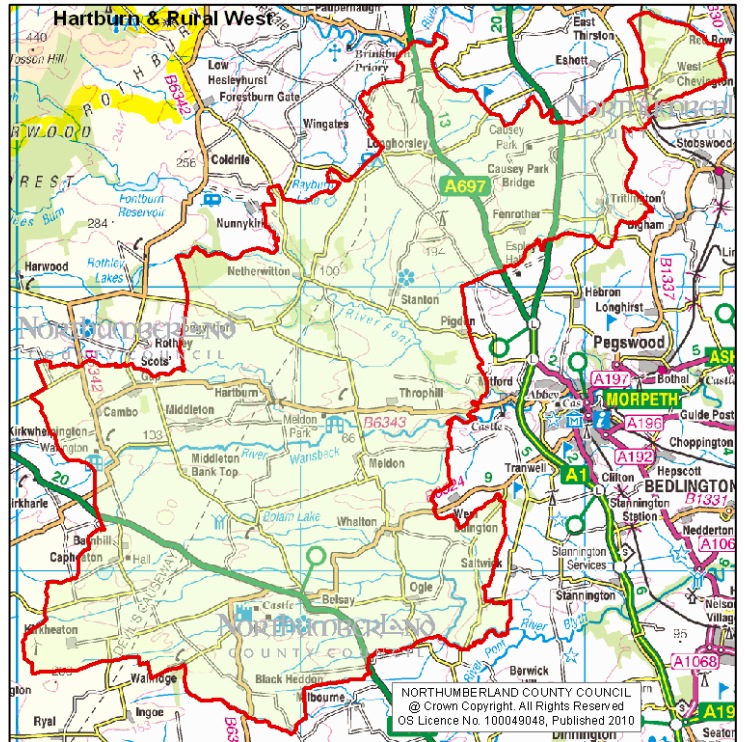


Hartburn & Rural West locality lies between the North and West Service Areas of Northumberland. The majority of the population and land area lie in the North Service Area so this profile uses the North Service Area for comparison. Hartburn and Rural West has a population of 3,317, it measures 267 km² in terms of area and has a population density of 12 people per km². Belsay Hall is located in Hartburn & Rural West locality.

Key Issues for Hartburn & Rural West Locality

People & Place

- 18.0% of the population are aged 0-15 years, 61.6% are of working age and 20.4% are aged 60+ (females) / 65+ (males).
- Between 2005–2007 the number of people aged 0-15 fell by 3.1%, the number of people of working age fell by 2.2%, while the number of older people increased by 8.3%.

Community Involvement & Cohesion

- 22.8% of people believe older people in their local area are able to get the services and support they need to continue to live at home for as long as they want to (North Northumberland 36.1%, Northumberland 36.2%).

Economic Well-being

- The largest percentage of people aged 16-74 are employed in agriculture hunting and forestry (14.4%), real estate (12.8%) and retail (12.2%).

Housing

- 74.0% of private dwellings are classified as non decent (North Northumberland 50.2%, Northumberland 40.9%).
- 24.3% of private dwellings are in a state of disrepair the highest percentage of all 27 localities (North Northumberland 13.2%, Northumberland 10.4%).
- 40.7% of private households are in fuel poverty (North Northumberland 24.6%, Northumberland 20.2%).
- 20.2% of private households are classified as vulnerable and non decent (North Northumberland 11.9%, Northumberland 10.4%).
- 6.3% of all dwellings are fall into council tax 'Band A' (North Northumberland 39.2%, Northumberland 48.1%).
- 52.7% of household spaces are detached (North Northumberland 28.8%, Northumberland 24.6%).
- 57.9% of all households are owner occupied (North Northumberland 64.1%, Northumberland 67.1%).
- The Average house price is £412,829 (North Northumberland £207,956, Northumberland £179,852).

Transport & Services

- 55.4% of all households own 2 or more cars or vans (North Northumberland 28.9%, Northumberland 28.1%).
- 4.3% of people are satisfied with local bus services the lowest of all 27 localities (North Northumberland 41.2%, Northumberland 45.4%).
- 12.0% of people are satisfied with local transport information the lowest of all 27 localities (North Northumberland 37.3%, Northumberland 41.3%).

Community Safety

- 60.8% of people think local public services are working to make their local area safer (North Northumberland 66.3%, Northumberland 65.0%).

Health & Social Well-being

- 63.3% of people are satisfied with their local hospital (North Northumberland 73.5%, Northumberland 75.6%).
